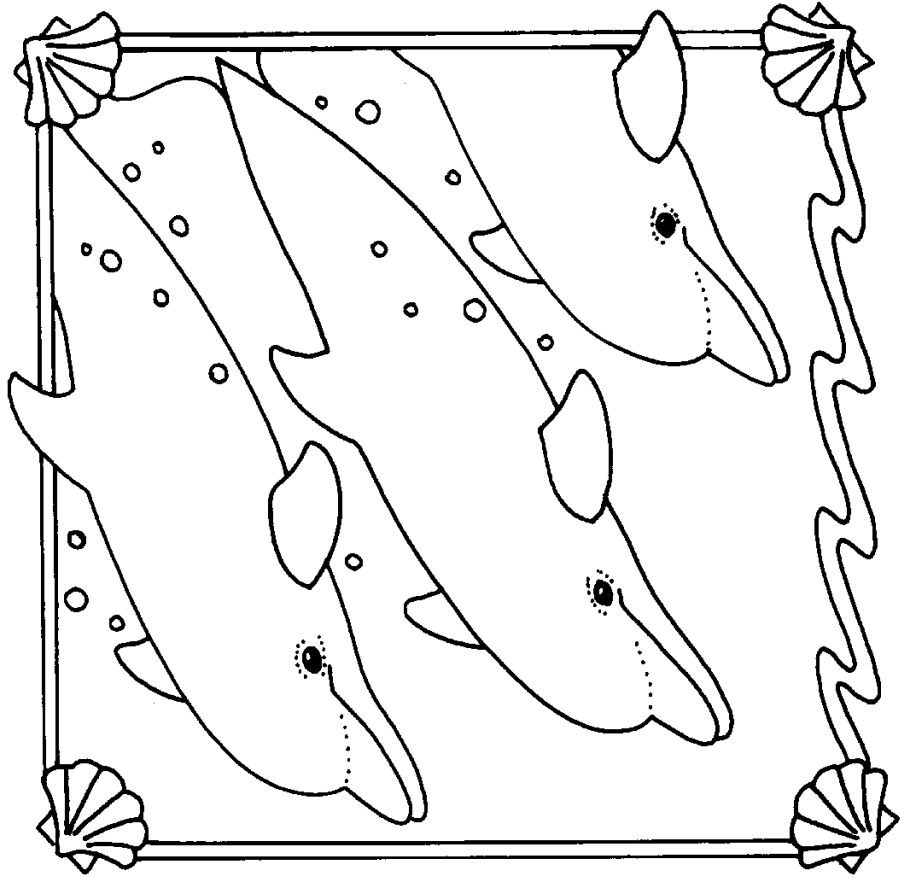
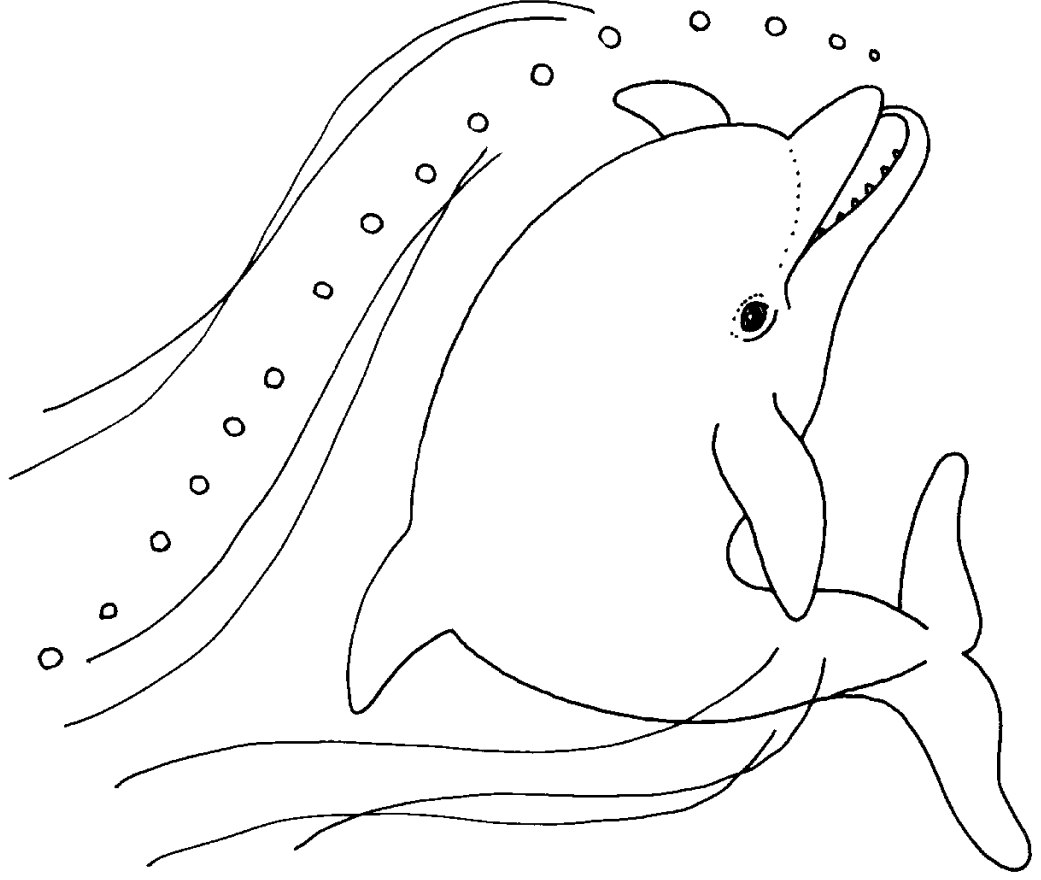


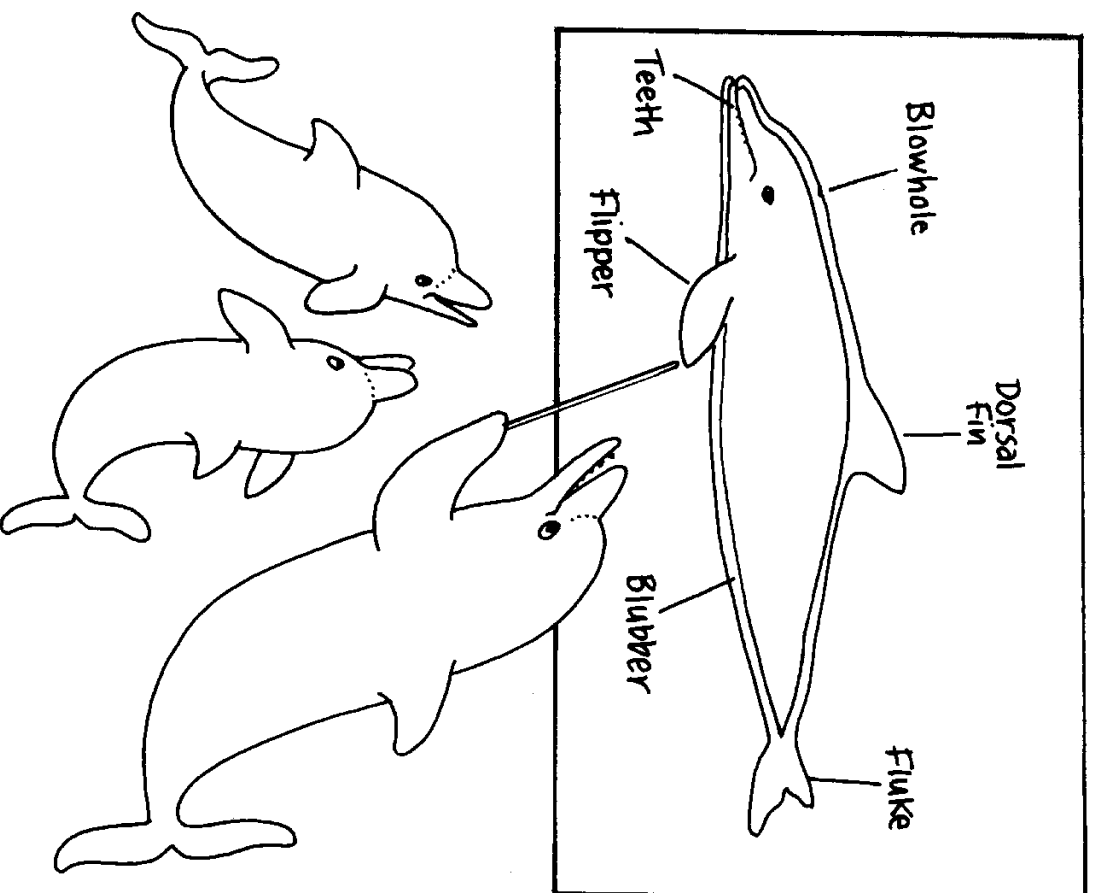
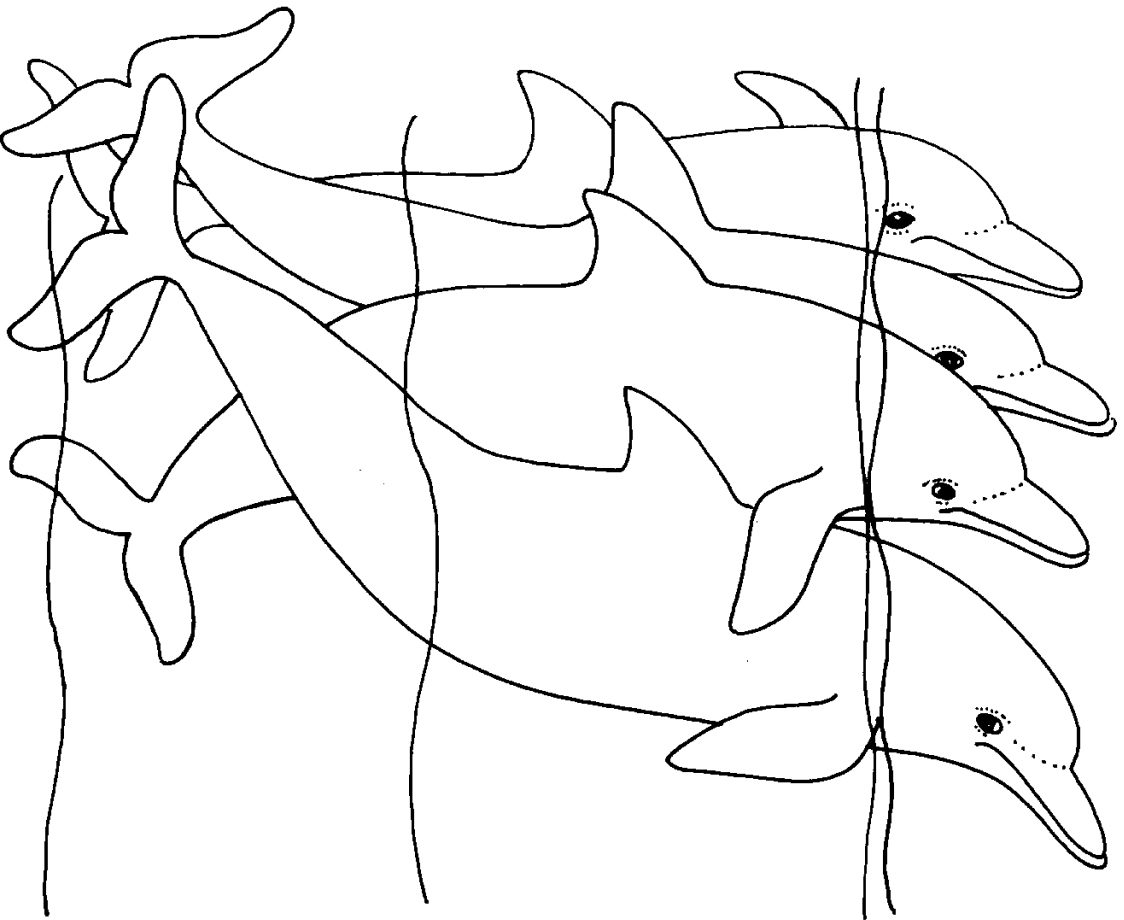
Dive, Dolphin, Dive!

Dolphins are mammals, not fish. They are friendly, smart, and playful. Dolphins look like they are smiling!

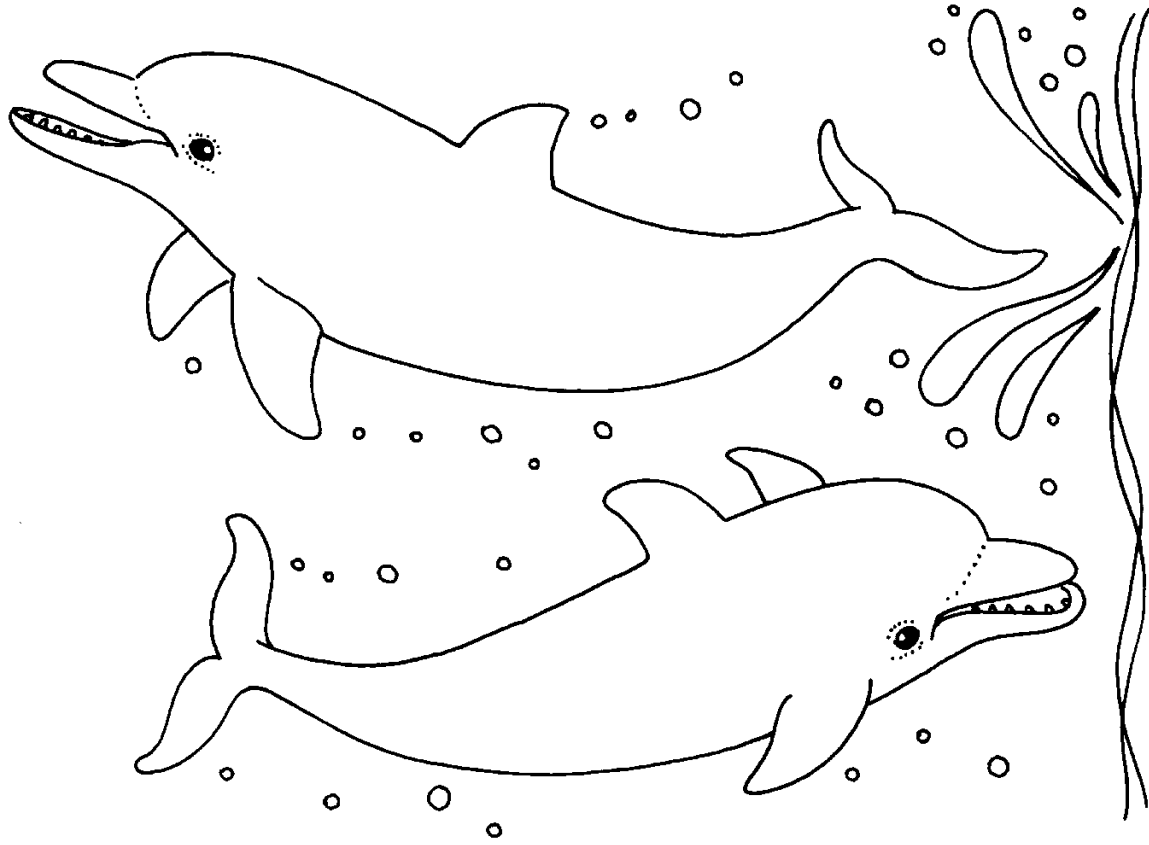

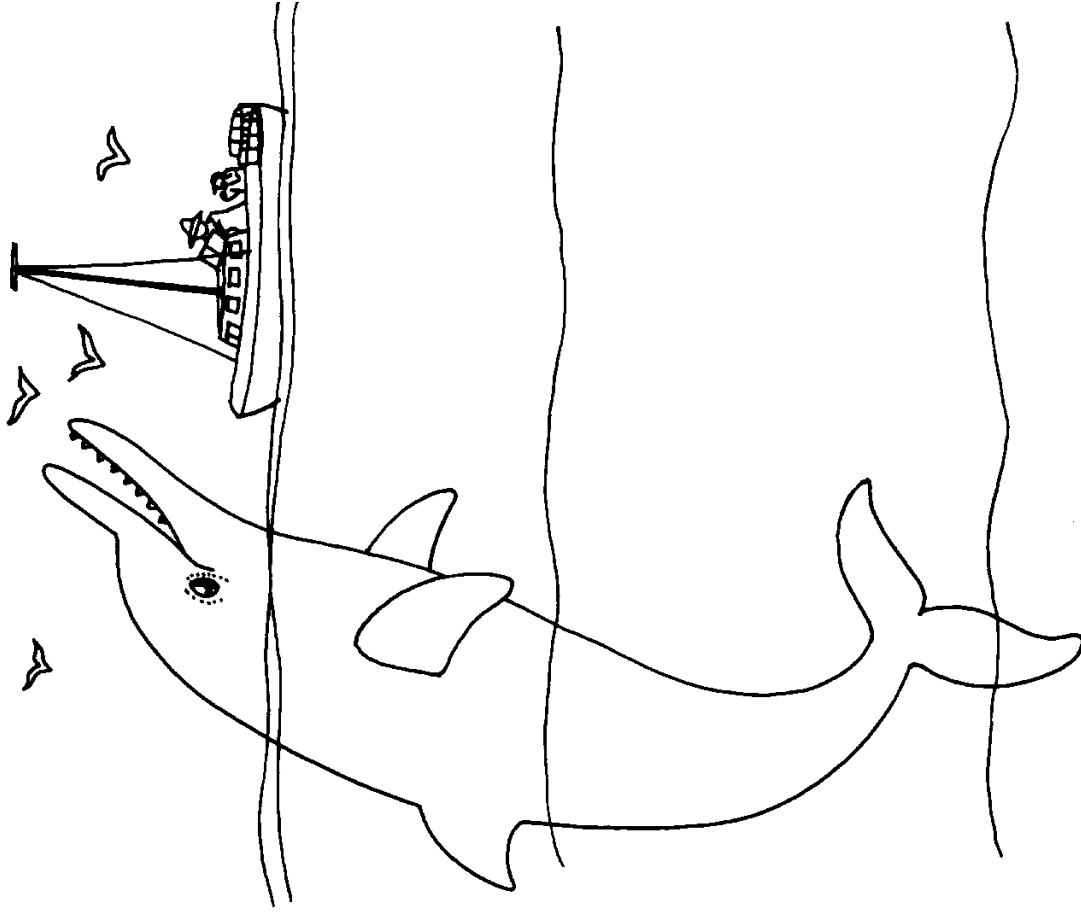
Dolphins play, hunt, and live together in a pod. When a dolphin is sick or hurt, the other dolphins help.

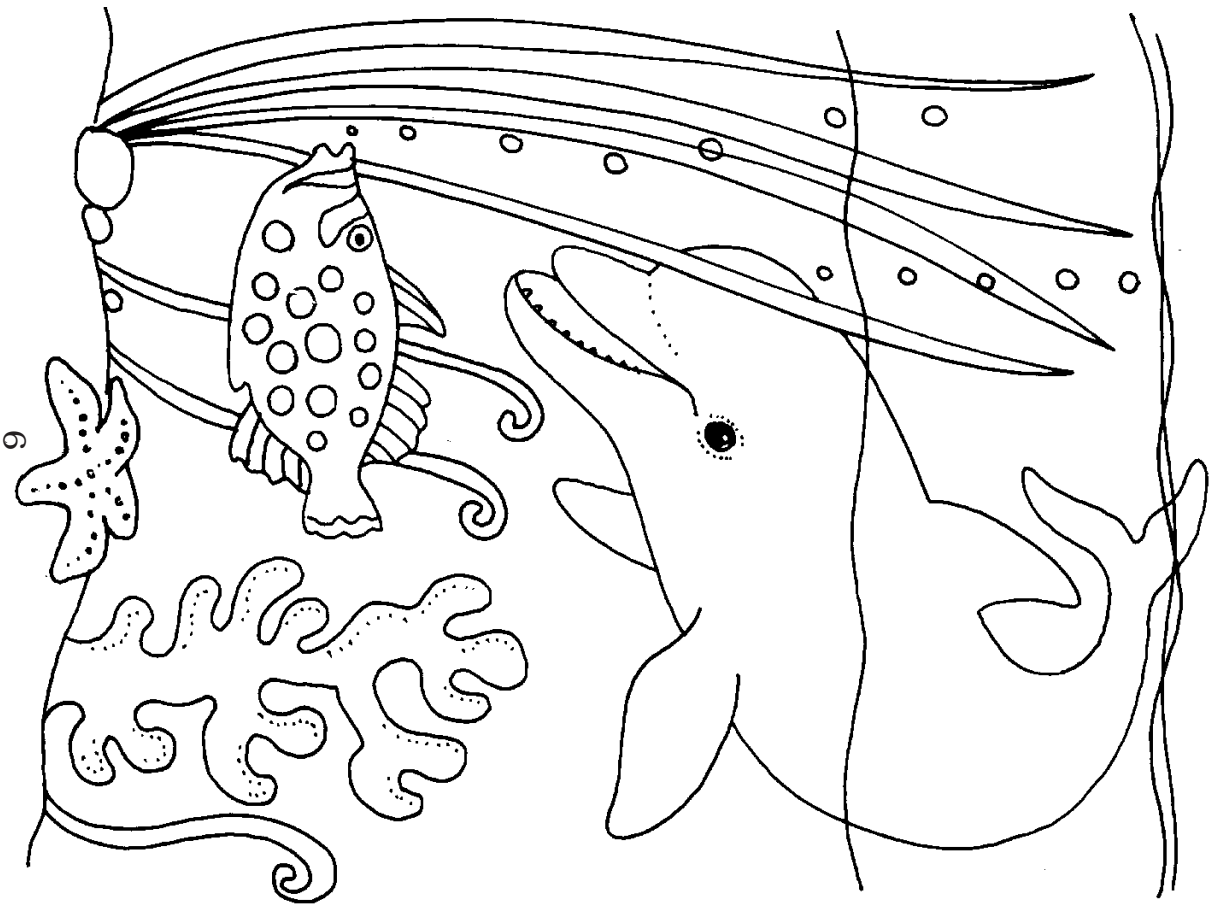


Dolphins like to have fun. They can dance on their tails and ride on big waves. Dolphins can twist, turn, zigzag, and even do somersaults.



Dolphins are curious. Sometimes they peek out of the water to look around. This is called spy hopping.

Dolphins like to eat fish and squid. A dolphin makes clicking sounds. The sounds echo back and tell the dolphin where to find its dinner. This is called echolocation.
